WHAT IS MEAGAN BEBENEK FOUNDATION



OUR STORY The story of Meagan Bebenek Foundation started with a beautiful, strong, and happy girl named Meagan Bebenek. Meagan was born on May 30th, 1996. On December 22, 2000, she was diagnosed with brain stem glioma, a malignant and inoperable brain tumour. Brain tumours are the leading cause of cancer-related death in children and young people up to age 20.

Despite this diagnosis, Meagan continued to live life to the fullest. She attended school when she was able, and showed strength and kindness to those around her. Meagan and her family were surrounded by a loving community at Our Lady of Sorrows School. Meagan never complained about her treatments, and made presents and drawings for her friends and caregivers. These gestures were her five-year-old way of saying thank you for the love and care, and perhaps even goodbye. Meagan passed away quietly on June 17, 2001 with her family at her side.

OUR IMPACT In 2001 Denise Bebenek, Meagan's mother, met with a small group of volunteers and experience, Denise knew that the statistics around paediatric brain tumours had to change, and that no family should have to walk such a path alone.

To date, Meagan Bebenek Foundation has raised over \$5.8 million dollars funding paediatric brain tumour research at The Arthur and Sonia Brain Tumour Research Centre (BTRC) in Toronto. The BTRC hosts the only program in Canada dedicated to paediatric brain tumour research.





OUR HUG Since 2001, Meagan Bebenek Foundation has hosted the annual "Meagan's Walk and HUG" event on Mother's Day weekend, raising awareness and significant funds for research. The event welcomes thousands from the GTA, across Ontario, and beyond, who gather at Fort York in Toronto, wend their way through the streets of Toronto, with the Walk culminating with participants joining hands in a "human hug" around The Hospital for Sick Children (SickKids). The "hug" is a simple gesture of support for all: you are not alone.

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Meagan Bebenek Foundation Neuro-oncology Fellowship

In 2013, Meagan Bebenek Foundation launched the Meagan Bebenek Foundation Neuro-oncology Fellowship to further clinical research and training in the subspecialty of paediatric neurooncology. This plays a pivotal role in working to achieve our goal of raising awareness and sharing a message of hope for all children who suffer from paediatric brain tumours. The Meagan Bebenek Foundation Neuro-Oncology Fellowship brings doctors from around the world to Toronto to work alongside the very best in the world.

Funding brain tumour research through the fellowship program empowers fellows to bring their knowledge and experience, as well as our message of hope back to their home countries.

Meagan Bebenek Foundation supports a "bench to bedside" philosophy, where whatever is learned in the research labs can be applied directly to the treatment of young patients and improving their care, quality of life and outcomes. Every Fellow has witnessed the power of our message and the "hug" and is eager to bring the Meagan Bebenek Foundation to their own countries.

To date, we have welcomed the Meagan Bebenek Foundation Fellows from Spain, the Czech Republic, Denmark, Brazil, Argentina and India (2).



Our School Program – Kids Helping Kids!

The Meagan Bebenek Foundation school program celebrates the theme "Kids helping Kids" and empowers youth to make a difference and foster compassion within their school communities.

Kids Helping Kids has been embraced by many school communities across the GTA and throughout Ontario. Students are given valuable leadership opportunities and are able to share their gifts and talents to help those in need.

Every school has a "Meagan", a student who could use our support and help. Each student, regardless of age, has the power within to make a real difference.

The Kids Helping Kids school program can look different in each school. Some schools join Meagan Bebenek Foundation each year, fundraising within their own community for our annual Meagan's HUG. This may be through a school spirit day or bake sale.

Others host a "hug" of their own, bringing the power of Meagan Bebenek Foundation to their school communities. Meagan Bebenek Foundation values all of its school partners and works tirelessly to continue developing the school program, so together we can have as strong an impact as possible.





The Crane Ceremony

The school program, Kids Helping Kids, was inspired by Meagan's own school community at Our Lady of Sorrows Elementary School. At the time of Meagan's diagnosis and throughout her treatment, this school family rallied around Meagan and her family with an outpouring of compassion and support.

The inspiration for what became known as The Crane Ceremony came from grade 8 student, Margaret. Margaret read a historical novel titled *Sadako and the Thousand Paper Cranes*, the story of a young girl who is a survivor of the bombing of Hiroshima.

Origami is the art of paper folding, and an origami crane is a symbol of hope. In the novel, Sadakosets out with a goal of folding a thousand cranes. In Japanese legend, if someone folds a thousand cranes, their wish will come true.

Inspired by Sadako, Margaret got to work quietly folding cranes, and it wasn't long before the entire school community was involved. Having surpassed their goal of folding a thousand cranes, on a special spring day, students gathered in the school yard, surrounding Meagan in "a circle of hope", and one by one, presented her with their colourful cranes with personal messages of hope and love written upon the wings.

Now every spring, in anticipation of the coming Meagan's HUG event, Meagan Bebenek Foundation hosts The Crane Ceremony, In a demonstration of hope and support, students from partnering schools across Toronto, present thousands of handmade origami cranes to Meagan's Bebenek Foundation Heroes, children affected by paediatric brain tumours, It reminds those children and their families that they are not alone.

School Spotlight



De La Salle College "Oaklands", the alma mater of Sarah Grace and Matthew Bebenek, Meagan's siblings, is deeply committed to Meagan Bebenek Foundation. De La Salle has made significant financial contributions to support Meagan Bebenek Foundation while simultaneously fostering a sense of purpose and compassion within the school community.

Every school can offer a unique value to Meagan Bebenek Foundation, and De La Salle can serve as an example of how to incorporate Meagan Bebenek Foundation's mission into your school community, and demonstrates that small acts can have big impact!



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Fundraising

In recent years, De La Salle has hosted an annual Meagan's Week, full of activities and events to unite the school community around the two key objectives of raising awareness and funds. All activities are structured with these goals in mind.

During Meagan's Week, a unique activity takes place daily at the school: a donation drive associated with pink and purple dress day; and sports tournaments, to name a few. In addition, De La Salle conducts bake sales throughout the year with proceeds going to Meagan Bebenek Foundation.

To launch Meagan's Week a school leader addresses the community, ensuring that all understand Meagan Bebenek Foundation's mission and goals. Frequently a Meagan Bebenek Foundation Hero, a young person who has personal experience with a brain tumour, is invited to participate in the Meagan's Week celebrations.

De La Salle also organizes a school team every year, where students are encouraged to register for the annual Meagan's HUG event on Mother's Day weekend. The school community sets fundraising goals and sets out to meet their objectives. This makes collecting additional donations as simple as possible.





The School HUG

Each year, De La Salle hosts its own Meagan's HUG on the school campus. This HUG engages all students and staff members, and often includes a visit from Meagan Bebenek Foundation Heroes. The "hug" event usually is planned to take place on the outdoor playing field at DLS. Music plays as the "hug" begins, and students are encouraged to create and bring signs to show their support. The spirit of togetherness and community are truly embodied in this activity.

The Crane Ceremony

De La Salle supports Meagan Bebenek Foundation's annual Crane Ceremony. Time is set aside during Meagan's Week to encourage students to create origami cranes that are later presented at the Ceremony. This is in keeping with the tradition that started the Crane Ceremony at Meagan's school, each crane inscribed with a message of hope and encouragement. On behalf of the school, a select group of students attend The Crane Ceremony to present the gift of cranes.

Meagan Bebenek Foundation Committee

De La Salle has a school based Meagan Bebenek Foundation committee year round. This group of students plans Meagan's Week for the school, coordinating donations and ensuring student engagement. Their focus is planning events to raise awareness about paediatric brain tumours, raising funds, and encouraging students to join the annual Meagan's HUG event.

Meagan's HUG Event

De La Salle invites members of the school community to participate in the annual Meagan's HUG event on Mother's Day weekend. With its own team fundraising page, the DLS team welcomes all members of the community, as well as family and friends, to attend this event. It's a great way to honour the spirit of Mother's Day!

In recent years, De La Salle music students have volunteered to play the national anthem at the beginning of the HUG event, and provide music for all participants.

Overall, De La Salle is a prime example of the power of community and the powerful impact of motivated individuals, who have a common goal.

Each school is unique, and with its talented members and capabilities, can create its own Meagan Bebenek Foundation legacy! We look forward to witnessing your school community's special efforts in support of Meagan Bebenek Foundaation!





FUNDRAISING IDEAS



Social outings are a great way to make friends and have some fun!

Gathering the school community at a favourite local bar, is a perfect way to raise money and awareness for Meagan Bebenek Foundation. Partner with a local establishment and host a night dedicated to Meagan Bebenek Foundation and explore the options!.

This may mean a portion of the admission fee is donated to the cause; or perhaps a percentage of each drink sold that evening can be a donation to Meagan Bebenek Foundation. Donation boxes could be set up at the venue for customers who would like to make additional contributions.

Selling tickets and wristbands for "free" admission or privileges to skip the line; or to enter into a raffle to win prizes; or raffle tickets can be sold individually. These are all ways to generate funds for a great cause!. To find raffle prizes, students are encouraged to reach out to potential donors within the community.

Pick a theme! Dress up the bar with some fun decor!

Bar nights have successfully taken place at many schools, such as Western University, where students explored partnership opportunities with local bars to drive engagement.

While a bar is a great idea, any venue that would be willing to host a large group is perfect! This may include your local school restaurant or any entertainment space.

Start a Meagan Bebenek Foundation School Chapter

Starting a Meagan Bebenek Foundation Chapter at your school is an awesome way to ensure continued involvement and commitment to making a difference.

If you are interested in creating a school chapter, you can incorporate many of the other fundraising activities listed into your annual activities. Although clubs can be structured in many ways, a typical team often includes:

Sponsorship and Fundraising Team:

This group of creative and motivated individuals is responsible for organizing the school fundraising page and planning various events to raise funds for Meagan Bebenek Foundation.

Events Team:

This group is responsible for facilitating the fundraising events, such as The Crane Ceremony or school "hug", and creating the necessary promotional

External Communications Team:

This team is responsible for contacting Meagan Bebenek Foundtaion ambassadors and maintaining strong communication channels. They must engage external partnerships for Meagan's Bebenek Foundation to connect with speakers and gather donations. They may also be required to manage relationships with the school administration and apply for the appropriate approvals and permits.



Host a Meagan's Week and HUG

A great idea to introduce Meagan Bebenek Foundation to your school would be to host a Meagan's Week. Each day of the week feature a different event, culminating in a School HUG at a prominent location or building on your school campus as an exciting finale for the Week!

Events could be for fundraising, such as a bake sale, raffle, carnival games, etc. Or for sharing a message of hope and raising awareness about the mission of Meagan Bebenek Foundation, such as presentations, guest speakers, etc.

In Toronto, many high schools host a Meagan's Week in early May, shortly before the date of the annual Meagan's HUG event. However, a Meagan's Week could be hosted at any time of year.

Here is an example of a possible Meagan's Week:



Raffle tickets can be sold all week. Other event ideas include selling donuts, hot chocolate, or succulents. Hosting a Meagan's Week may require permission from your university's student council and/or affiliation with a ratified school club.



Host a Paper Crane **Making Class**

The story of the Meagan Bebenek Foundation's Crane Ceremony is one of humanity, compassion and a call to action.

Origami is the Japanese art of paper folding. Hosting an origami crane making class is a great way to learn a new skill, gather as a community and show your support for those who are suffering from paediatric brain tumours. It is important to make sure participants understand the origin of the Meagan Bebenek Foundation's Crane Ceremony, and its connection to the beginnings of this organization.

Hosting an origami crane making class is simple! Gather a group of students with one instructor and learn how to make a crane. Use colourful paper, fold various sized cranes and leave messages of hope on the paper.

Host a Sporting Event
